

## **What IRS Form 990 Does**





### What IRS Form 990 Does

Reports detailed information on an organization's activities to the government and the public.

### Quantitative

### Financial

 Operating results and financial position, compensation paid to officers, directors, key employees, highest-compensated employees, and highly compensated independent contractors

### Non-financial

• E.g., time contributed by board members, number of volunteers, and program statistics

### Qualitative

 Processes regarding conflicts of interest, executive compensation review, program accomplishments, and Form 990 review



### What IRS Form 990 Does - Continued

### Demonstrates compliance with the Internal Revenue Code


- Public support test (Schedule A)
- Lobbying activities (Schedule C)

### Reports Key Relationships

- Business transactions with interested persons (Schedule L)
- Related nonprofit organization (Schedule R)



- Core Form (file <u>one</u>)
  - 0 990
  - o 990-EZ
  - o 990-N
  - o 990-PF
- Supplemental 990 Schedules
  - Schedules A through R
  - Schedule B's Unique Nature
- 990-T (Unrelated Business Income Tax)
- Understanding State-specific 990 Filing Requirements



# When it Should be Filed





### When it Should be Filed

# Due the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the fifth month following year-end (i.e., 4 ½ months)

~ File IRS Form 8868 for an automatic six-month extension

# Organizations have 10 ½ months in total to file 990

~ Visit IRS.gov and monitor the media for additional extensions due to disasters, etc.


### File annually and on time

- ~ Late penalties are \$100 per calendar day (or \$20 for smaller organizations)
- ~ Missing returns for three years results in revocation of tax-exempt status

# Returns must now be filed electronically



## **Common Pitfalls to Avoid**





### **Common Pitfalls to Avoid**

Monitor your public support percentage

Prepare pro forma calculations if necessary


Consider a 501(h) election if you lobby

Consider the Part VI "policies not required by the Internal Revenue Code"

Don't wait until the last minute to file

### **Additional Considerations**

# IRS TE / GE Governance Board Priorities:

- Improper filing of 990-N
- Compensating employee(s) over \$1 million without reporting IRC
  Section 4960 excise tax (21%) on Form 4720
- Small nonprofits with retirement plans
- Worker classification issues
- Incorrectly treating workers as independent contractors instead of employees
- Affects under-reporting of FICA and may result in noncompliance with 401(k)/403(b)
- IRS has emphasized using "data-driven" techniques to detect potential non-compliance
